

2012 Bible Reading Plan – Week 6

Monday, February 20: Exodus 21-22 Psalm 31 Matthew 26

Scriptural Prayer: Then he returned to his disciples and found them sleeping. “Couldn’t you men keep watch with me for one hour?” he asked Peter. “Watch and pray so that you will not fall into temptation. The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak.”

(Matthew 26:40-41)

My Prayer: May the Holy Spirit help us to overcome the weakness of our flesh and that we will be watchful and pray. May God help us be willing to watch and pray for one hour. Come and join the prayer meeting this week!

Healing Prayer: “Put the sword back in its place,” Jesus said. (Matthew 26: 51-52)

When we lose control of our emotions, it is like our swords are lost among enemies, and we could hurt ourselves and others. Let us learn how to reply on the Holy Spirit and pray, so we will be able to ease our emotions, “The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak.” Let us pray that we will “put the sword back in its place” when we deal with others. Let us replace jealousy and hatred with serenity, peace and forgiveness.

Tuesday, February 21: Exodus 23-24 Psalm 32 Matthew 27

Scriptural Prayer: About three in the afternoon Jesus cried out in a loud voice, “Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?”--which means “My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?”. (Matthew 27:46)

My Prayer: Praise the Lord! He died on the cross for our sins and He suffered the separation from God for our sake. Let us be grateful to Him for dying for our sins and for His forgiveness.

Healing Prayer: My bones wasted away (Psalms 32: 3-4)

May the Holy Spirit shine on me so it may reveal whether I cover up my iniquity and sinful thoughts. Let us confess our transgression to the Lord and know that He forgives the guilt of our sin. And He will heal us from bones being wasted away.

Wednesday, February 22: Exodus 25-26 Psalm 33 Matthew 28

Scriptural Prayer: Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.”(Matthew 28: 19-20)

My Prayer: Please pray for all cell groups in our church. Let every cell member be our Lord’s disciple. Let us go and invite others to be disciples. Let us obey God’s commandments and walk with Jesus.

Healing Prayer: God is the Lord (Psalms 33: 12)

In the world we live in, many people believe in many gods. Some are sculpted by hands, while some are from people’s imaginations. People tend to rely on some sort of god for security or comfort. However, “bless is the nation whose God is the Lord. Our Father in heaven, hallowed by your name.”

Thursday, February 23: Exodus 27-28 Psalm 34 Mark 1

Scriptural Prayer: “Come, follow me,” Jesus said, “and I will send you out to fish for people.” At once they left their nets and followed him. (Mark 1: 17-18)

My Prayer: O Lord, I pray that I will listen to you when you call me, at once I will leave my nets (leave what I am doing) and follow you. O Lord, make me “fish for people” in my life, just like you told Simon and his brother Andrew. Make me your disciple.

Healing Prayer: Whoever of you loves life and desires to see many good days. (Psalms 34: 12-14)

Everyone desires to see many good days, but the secret is to keep your tongue from evil and your lips from speaking lies. Turn from evil and do good; seek peace and pursue it. For sure you will enjoy more days of life.

Friday, February 24: Exodus 29-30 Psalm 35 Mark 2

Scriptural Prayer: Then he said to them, “The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath. So the Son of Man is Lord even of the Sabbath.” (Mark 2:17-18)

My Prayer: O Lord! Please help us to realize that “the Son of Man is Lord even of the Sabbath.” Let us not be the Sunday Christians, instead let us be willing to come to every day to worship you and praise you, Lord.

Healing Prayer: The paralyzed man (Mark 2: 1-12)

O Lord! Please give us faith like the paralyzed man. Let us work together and carry a friend who is paralyzed to you. Please forgive us for our sins and heal us. Pray that our paralyzed friend will get healed and start walking. The healing will happen!

Saturday, February 25: Exodus 31-34 Psalm 36

Scriptural Prayer: How priceless is your unfailing love, O God! People take refuge in the shadow of your wings. They feast on the abundance of your house; you give them drink from your river of delights. For with you is the fountain of life; in your light we see light. (Psalm 36:7-9)

My Prayer: O God, I hunger and thirst for you. Only you are my provider. I desire to take refuge in the shadow of your wings and to drink from your river of delights. I pray for my friends around me. May they also come before you and seek you. I pray that they will see light in you and live

in you.

Healing Prayer: Remove the veil (Exodus 34: 33-35)

“Veil” often means the barrier between God and us. It is also the barrier between men. Only we can remove the veil and show our face to God. Only then God can make our face “radiant” like Moses. Let us remove our “veil” to show our true selves among others and build a trusting relationship with others.
